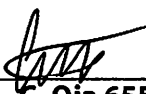

NARRATIVE

On 3/9/11, a CPS referral was generated after fifteen-year-old (RR) disclosed to a mandated reporter that she had been raped over a span of several years. The suspect was identified as thirty nine-year-old Aaron Dalan. (RR) was interviewed by a child forensic interviewer on 3/15/11 at the Yakima Police Department.

During the interview, (RR) disclosed a long history of sexual abuse by Dalan. (RR) was able to describe in detail several incidents of sexual intercourse with Dalan. She told the interviewer of the last time that Dalan engaged in intercourse with her in April 2010, when she was fourteen-years-old. She went to Dalan's residence in Yakima, where Dalan engaged in sexual intercourse with (RR).

(RR) described the first time that Dalan engaged in sexual intercourse with her when she was ten years old in March of 2006.

(RR) was able to describe a third incident that occurred after Dalan took her home on 5/16/09 when she was twelve years old. This incident occurred after an event that the two attended together. The two went back to Dalan's residence and engaged in sexual intercourse in Dalan's bedroom.

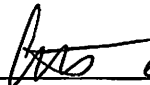
(RR) told the interviewer that all of the incidents that took place at Dalan's residence in Yakima. (RR) was also able to describe two incidents where sexual intercourse occurred outside of the City of Yakima. One incident in 2008 occurred in a hotel in Tri-Cities during a soccer tournament. The other incident occurred in a cabin near Cle Elum.

The victim was able to describe specific sensory detail of each incident to the interviewer. Dates of the sexual encounters have been corroborated through the investigation.

On 3/7/11, fifteen-year-old [REDACTED] was in a therapy session with her counselor Lindsey Vaagen. During the session, [REDACTED] disclosed to Vaagen that she had been raped

by Aaron Dalan over a period of several years. A CPS referral was generated after the disclosure, which was assigned to me to investigate on 3/9/11.

I was familiar with [REDACTED] from having investigated another case involving her in 2010. (YPD #10-4921) [REDACTED] had disclosed to a school counselor in 2010 that her [REDACTED] Daniel Nunez had molested her around February 2006. The case was investigated and sent to Franklin County for a prosecutor to review. No charges were filed in the case. During that investigation, it was learned that [REDACTED] had mentioned to a family member through text messages that Aaron Dalan had also abused her. That information was investigated through a follow-up interview conducted by Det. Janis on 6/8/10. During that interview, there was insufficient information to support a belief that criminal activity had occurred.

When I received this case on 3/9/11, I contacted Lindsey Vaagen to find out additional information about the recent disclosure. Vaagen told me during our phone conversation that [REDACTED] had undergone what she described as a "dissociative episode" during the therapy session on 3/7/11. Vaagen said she used the term "dissociative episode" was because it was the most clinical term she could think of to describe what was happening. She told me that [REDACTED] closed her eyes and put her head down and began speaking. Vaagen said that during this time, [REDACTED] told her that she had been raped. Vaagen said that [REDACTED] identified the person as her [REDACTED] Aaron Dalan. Vaagen did not ask specific question about the abuse, and did not obtain any specific details. [REDACTED] did indicate that the abuse had occurred over four to five year period. Vaagen clarified that [REDACTED] had introduced the term "rape" during the session.

On 3/11/11, I contacted Aaron Buchanan from the Yakima County Prosecutor's Office Victim/Witness Unit to inquire if he had contacts with a child forensic interviewer from Kittitas County. He provided me with the contact information Lisa Larabie, who works as a victim/witness specialist in Kittitas County. I made contact with Larabie and advised her of my case. I asked if she would be willing to conduct a child forensic interview as part of this case investigation. She agreed, and arrangements were made for the interview to take place on 3/15/11 at approximately 1000 hours.

I made arrangements with [REDACTED] mother Sonia Rodriguez to have [REDACTED] brought to the Yakima Police Department on 3/15/11 for the interview. The interview was conducted in the child interview room at the Yakima Police Department Special Assault Office. The interview was recorded using audio and video recording equipment. I watched the video in an adjacent room on a video monitor.

During the interview, [REDACTED] began disclosing sexual abuse by Aaron Dalan. She told Larabie about five specific events in which Dalan had engaged her in sexual intercourse. Three of the events that were discussed took place in Dalan's home located at 209 S 39th Ave. [REDACTED] said that those three encounters all occurred in Dalan's room, on his bed. Two other incidents of sexual intercourse were also described. One incident occurred in a hotel in the Tri-Cities prior to a soccer tournament. Another incident occurred at Dalan's parent's cabin near Cle Elum.

Larabie was able to narrow the time period for the five specific events that were disclosed. The first and last times that sexual intercourse occurred between the two were described. [REDACTED] was also able to describe a sexual encounter after a soccer tournament called the "Yakattack." [REDACTED] told Larabie that her team had gone to the championship at that tournament. She provided details regarding the tournament in Tri Cities, citing that the team had won a third place trophy. [REDACTED] did not know the month or year of that tournament, but told me that the trophy was in her room.

The interview with [REDACTED] was stopped momentarily as batteries in the digital recorder were exhausted. A new battery was placed in the recorder and the interview resumed. [REDACTED] was also provided a break in the middle of the interview due to its length. The video recording remained on the entire duration. Two drawings were produced during the interview that depicted the inside of Dalan's residence and the interior of the cabin near Cle Elum. Photocopies of the drawings were made. The originals were submitted as evidence.

A complete transcript of the interview is attached to this report.

On 3/16/11, I contacted Sonia Rodriguez to schedule an interview with her the following day. I asked Sonia to bring items from her residence that would assist in identifying the specific soccer tournaments that [REDACTED] had discussed in her interview. Sonia arrived at the police department at the scheduled time. She brought with her a broken trophy and a medal from two different soccer tournaments. The trophy was from the soccer tournament in Tri Cities. It showed 2008 as the year when [REDACTED] played on a U12 (twelve and under) team that Dalan coached. The medal was from the "Yakattack" tournament and had 2009 on it. Sonia told me that after [REDACTED] had disclosed the sexual abuse, she destroyed much of the soccer memorabilia in her bedroom, including the trophy. Sonia said team photos containing Dalan were some of the items destroyed. She found the broken trophy under [REDACTED] bed.

Sgt. B. George and I interviewed [REDACTED] in the Special Assault Office at YPD. The interview was recorded with audio and video recording equipment. During the interview, Sonia detailed her relationship with Dalan. She said that the [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. The two lived together at 209 S 39th Ave until January 2004 when Sonia [REDACTED]. She said that she had wanted Dalan to leave the residence before, but he would not until [REDACTED]. Dalan eventually moved to The Oaks Apartments on S 41st Ave.

Sonia said that Dalan lived in an apartment until the summer of 2005, when she and [REDACTED] moved out of the residence on S 39th Ave. Dalan moved back into the home after they vacated the residence. Sonia said that Dalan had remained active in [REDACTED] life throughout [REDACTED] afterwards. He continued to coach [REDACTED] soccer team. [REDACTED] maintained a room at Dalan's residence. This was the same room she had occupied when she had lived at the house.

Sonia described how Dalan would take [REDACTED] to soccer practices or go out to eat. She described being able to leave [REDACTED] with Dalan when she would have to work or had other commitments. [REDACTED] would sometimes spend the nights at Dalan's residence, a practice that began when Dalan was residing in his apartment. Sonia said that the visits would occur once a week or a couple times throughout the month. She did not describe any set schedule for the visits, although they frequently coincided with soccer activities.

During the interview, Sonia stated that [REDACTED] never appeared all that excited about the visits with Dalan. She said that [REDACTED] never appeared happy when she was picked up. Sonia told me that she always picked [REDACTED] up at the 209 S 39th Ave address.

Sonia talked about [REDACTED] soccer activities. She said that Dalan had coached [REDACTED] between 2005 and 2008. Sonia told me that at one point [REDACTED] had wanted to stop playing soccer all together. She told me that [REDACTED] wanted off of Dalan's team and was very concerned about not qualifying for a select team which required a try-out. [REDACTED] eventually made the select team where Dalan was not the coach in 2008.

Sonia told me that [REDACTED] had told her that she no longer wanted to see Dalan and wanted her mother to tell him not to come to her games. Sonia said that she believed that [REDACTED] father Artemio Rodriguez had spoken to Dalan and asked him not to come to the "Yakattack" tournament. Sonia was not certain if Artemio had in fact conveyed that to Dalan. She said that Dalan continued to come to [REDACTED] games, including the Yakattack tournament and Davis High School games.

Sonia had become aware of one incident that had taken place when Dalan was still residing in his apartment. [REDACTED] had revealed that she had slept in the same bed as Dalan. Sonia said that she thought that the incident was just "poor boundary issues."

I asked Sonia to describe her past sexual history with Dalan, looking for any particular or unique sexual behaviors. She did indicate that Dalan would sometimes [REDACTED]. Sonia said she could remember very little as it had been a long time. She also appeared uncomfortable with the line of questioning. Sonia did not believe that [REDACTED] had ever seen she and Aaron engaged in intercourse. She told me that [REDACTED] "may have" heard them engaged in intercourse. Sonia told me that Dalan wore Boxer's or boxer style briefs.

A complete transcript of the interview with Sonia Rodriguez is attached to this report.

An individual identified as Evi Licona continued to arise throughout both the interview with Sonia and [REDACTED]. I learned that Licona is that former fiancé of Aaron Dalan. Licona has a private law practice in Yakima. Sonia Rodriguez had indicated that [REDACTED] had previously disclosed some information about he alleged abuse to Licona. Licona had also lived in the residence with Dalan at 209 S 39th Ave during the time period when some of the abuse occurred.

I was able to contact Licona and arrange a time to meet with her in the afternoon of 3/17/11. Det. Sigler and I went to Licona's law office at 307 N 3rd St. When we arrived, Licona advised that she had asked her attorney to be present for the interview. The interview was recorded, in the presence of her attorney Greg Scott. Licona was told that she was in no way the focus of our investigation.

During the interview, Licona described her relationship with Sonia Rodriguez as a professional acquaintance. She described that her relationship with [REDACTED] had developed while she was dating Dalan. Licona described how she and [REDACTED] had become close. Licona did not recall [REDACTED] ever spending the night at Dalan's while she resided in the residence. She said that she was aware of a time when [REDACTED] had stayed at the residence prior to her moving in with Dalan.

Licona stayed in contact with [REDACTED] after she and Dalan split up. [REDACTED] would sometimes visit with Licona at her office or in her home. Licona told me that she would sometimes go out to eat with [REDACTED] or talk on the phone. On one occasion, [REDACTED] had come into Licona's office and made a disclosure about abuse at the hands of Dalan. She told Licona that she wasn't speaking to Dalan anymore. When Licona inquired as to the reason, [REDACTED] told her Dalan had done something to her, but did not expound. She asked [REDACTED] if it was similar to what her [REDACTED] Daniel Nunez had done and [REDACTED] said that it was.

A short time later [REDACTED] had gone over to Licona's residence. She made an additional disclosure about abuse at the hands of Dalan. She told Licona that Dalan had touched her "down there" referring to her genital area. Licona said that she believed that the touching had occurred over [REDACTED] clothing. She did not know when the abuse occurred, but indicated that [REDACTED] and Dalan had been in bed together. Licona did not report the disclosure to authorities. She said that she did confront Dalan about it.

Licona was questioned about her and Dalan's sexual relationship to explore any preferences, behaviors and habits for corroborative purposes. She was very uncomfortable with the line of questioning and had difficulty recalling much detail.

On 3/18/11, I received a phone call from Licona. She said that she had difficulty sleeping the night following the interview. She told me that she had remembered some details about her and Dalan's sex life. Licona told me that Dalan would sometimes withdraw [REDACTED]
[REDACTED]

On 3/18/11, I prepared applications for search warrant and an order to intercept and record communications. I also prepared an order for the appointment of a Special Master due to the potential of privileged attorney/client communications being encountered during the service of the search warrant. Det. Janis and I went to Kittitas Superior Court to apply for the warrants. We were accompanied by Yakima City Attorney Bronson Faul. Judge Sparks reviewed and issued the orders.

On 3/19/11, Det. Janis and I met with [REDACTED] in her home. She had previously agreed to attempt the one party consent recorded phone calls. We met with her in her residence at [REDACTED]. Present were her mother and step-father. [REDACTED] asked that they both leave while the recorded calls were attempted and they complied. The initial call at 1807 hours was unsuccessful due to Dalan not answering the phone. Two text messages were sent to Aaron Dalan's mother Pam Dalan with who [REDACTED] is acquainted. The messages inquired if Pam knew where Dalan was and indicated that [REDACTED] wanted to talk to him. Pam responded via text message, indicating that she had spoken with Aaron.

Aaron Dalan called [REDACTED] phone and left a voicemail. The message indicated that he would be home for the rest of the evening. Another attempt at the recorded phone call was made and Dalan answered. [REDACTED] conversed with Dalan for approximately thirty-five minutes. The conversation began discussing soccer. [REDACTED] began to discuss the incident in which Dalan was in bed with [REDACTED] at his apartment.

During the call, [REDACTED] begins to confront Dalan about an incident in which she was in the same bed with him. As she begins to approach the subject, Dalan made no strong denials. He tells [REDACTED] that he doesn't believe anything happened, then goes on to state that he was more than sure nothing inappropriate happened. Dalan suggests that [REDACTED] is not remembering things accurately and that he disagrees with her memory. A full transcript of the call is attached to the report.

On 3/20/11, Officer Durbin and I went to [REDACTED] residence to attempt additional phone calls. We drove past Dalan's residence and observed a vehicle belonging to his girlfriend Quinn Rosborough parked in the driveway. No phone calls were attempted on 3/20/11 due to the presence of Rosborough at the residence.

On 3/21/11, Detective Janis and I went to [REDACTED] residence to attempt additional phone calls. We drove past Dalan's residence prior to going to [REDACTED]. I observed Dalan inside the residence through a large picture window. There were no other vehicles in the driveway indicating the presence of anyone else. Two additional phone calls were attempted by [REDACTED] neither was answered. [REDACTED] also sent a text message that went unanswered.

On 3/22/11, I prepared an SIR for the charges of Rape of a Child 1st degree, Rape of a Child 2nd degree and Rape of a Child 3rd degree due to the corresponding times of the sexual encounters [REDACTED] had described in her interview with Larabie. Det. Janis and I went to the Yakima County Jail and waited outside. Dalan was in a scheduled hearing in one of the jail courtrooms in the basement of the jail. He exited the building at approximately 1530 hours. Det. Janis and I approached Dalan and identified ourselves as detectives.

I told Dalan that there was probable cause for his arrest and that I was placing him under arrest. I told him that he needed to come with us to the police department. When I told Dalan that he was under arrest, there was a significant change in his body language and posture. Dalan's knees buckled slightly and his shoulders dropped. He began to say

something, but cut himself off. Dalan never asked what he was being arrested for. He did not ask any questions about the investigation. He was secured in the front of my assigned detectives car. I did a visual inspection of his briefcase for any weapons and then gave it back to him due to the fact that it possibly contained privileged attorney/client information. I read Dalan his Miranda rights from a department issued card. He indicated that he understood his rights and invoked his right to counsel.

Dalan was transported to the Yakima Police Department and secured in a detective's interview room. He was left in possession of his briefcase. Dalan's work cell phone was secured in an envelope outside of the interview room. His personal cell phone was seized as evidence in the case. I informed Dalan that we would be serving a search warrant at his residence shortly. He was provided with a copy of the search warrant.

Shortly after our arrival at the police department, Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Quinn Rosborough arrived. Rosborough is Aaron Dalan's current girlfriend. She had been notified of the arrest just after Dalan was taken into custody. Sgt. George and I interviewed Rosborough in the child interview room at the Yakima Police Department. Rosborough agreed to have the interview recorded using a digital audio recorder. She was very emotional and upset by the arrest. Rosborough was crying and had difficulty talking about that case. At one point she doubled over, placing her head against the armrest of the couch and cried inconsolably.

Rosborough asked to go off the record twice during the interview. The first instance was during questions regarding any sexual habits. Rosborough said that she knew we were going to ask questions regarding sex between the two. She asked to stop the recording, which I did. Rosborough explained that she was concerned that all the information was discoverable and that her colleagues as well as defense attorneys she would go up against would have access to this personal information. Rosborough went on to explain that she was Christian and did not believe in or choose to engage in premarital sex. She said that she and Dalan had "made out" but never engaged in sex. After addressing this concern I activated the recorder again.

Rosborough remained very emotional and was on the verge of tears for the duration of the interview. She asked questions several times about the case. Rosborough described her relationship with Dalan and how the two became acquainted. Rosborough was familiar with the relationship of Aaron Dalan and [REDACTED]. She told me that she had never met [REDACTED]. She did not appear to have any knowledge of [REDACTED] staying at Dalan's residence since the two began dating or spending time together around 2009.

I asked questions about her knowledge of a previous case that I had investigated in 2010 involving Daniel Nunez and [REDACTED]. Rosborough again asked to go off the record and I stopped the recorder. She explained that she didn't know if she could talk about the matter since it was a separate case. The recorder was again activated after her concerns were addressed. Rosborough seemed familiar with the case although she did not handle it. The case had been sent to Franklin County for review and was not handled by prosecutors from Yakima County. I asked Rosborough if she was aware that Dalan's

name had come up in that investigation, or if she had conveyed to him that it had. She claimed that she was unaware he had been mentioned in the investigation.

Through the interview and the questions asked, it appears that Rosborough deduced that the victim in the case was [REDACTED]. At the end of the interview she stated that if [REDACTED] was the victim, she did not believe it.

After the interview with Rosborough we transported Dalan to his residence to serve the search warrant. I was assisted in serving the warrant by Sgt. B. George, Sgt. K. Willard, Det. Janis, Officer Grant and YPD Evidence Specialist K. Drury. Prior to serving the warrant, Dalan was seated in the front seat of my unmarked Detective vehicle. I was outside the vehicle. I observed Dalan inside the vehicle crying. I could see Dalan's shoulders rising and falling as if sobbing. This was also observed by Sgt. Willard, who called it to my attention.

The door was opened using Dalan's house keys. Dalan remained on the couch in the upstairs living room while the warrant was served. Photographs of the residence were taken and a video of the interior of the residence was made. I observed that there were very few personal photographs throughout the house. There were numerous photographs of [REDACTED] and the various soccer teams that Dalan had coached.

During the search of the residence, bedding was collected from the master bedroom. The bed was unmade when we arrived. The comforter/duvet and sheets were collected. The mattress was collected. I located a red plaid duvet cover in the bedroom across from the bathroom. The plaid duvet cover was folded at the bottom of the bedroom closet, where Dalan appeared to keep some of his linens. [REDACTED] had described the bedding on Dalan's bed as a red plaid comforter. The duvet cover was collected as evidence.

Dalan accompanied me downstairs into the T.V./computer room. His computer was seized as part of the search warrant. The computer tower was unplugged and placed into a large paper bag. The bag was sealed with evidence tape and Dalan signed the seal. The computer was sealed in this fashion per the instructions of the Special Master Order.

I observed that there were many more photographs of [REDACTED] throughout the T.V. room. Drury photographed all the various photos located throughout the residence. Also located in the downstairs storage room were boxes and organizers full of Legos. The pieces were all organized by color and sizes. [REDACTED] had described Dalan's Legos in her interview with Larabie.

Dalan did not ask any questions regarding the case while at the house. There was no discussion about the victim or her identity. Near the conclusion of serving the warrant, Dalan advised that he had skipped lunch earlier that day and asked if he could eat some yogurt. I allowed Dalan to get yogurt from the refrigerator. I remained with him in the kitchen. While at the refrigerator, Dalan directed my attention to two drawings, one of which appeared to be a hand drawn birthday card. He told me "You'll probably want to take those. They are from her." [REDACTED] name was signed on the bottom of one of the

drawings, which was of a sliver moon. This was the first indication that Dalan was aware of the identity of the victim. Dalan was allowed to change some of his clothing and use the restroom while at the residence.

The evidence collected was transported to the Yakima Police Department and secured, with exception of the sealed computer tower. The computer remained with myself and Dalan. Det. Janis and I drove with Dalan and the computer to the Kittitas County Sheriffs Office in Ellensburg. The computer was stored in their evidence storage, until it could be transferred to the Kittitas Superior Court the following day. Prior to returning to Yakima, I stopped at a Subway restaurant where Dalan was allowed to eat dinner. He had been in custody for several hours at that point and was allowed to order a meal. He was then transported back to Yakima and booked into the Yakima County Jail.

On 3/23/11, Det. Janis and I returned to the Kittitas County Sheriffs Office to retrieve the computer and transfer it to the Kittitas Superior Court as per the instructions of the Special Master Order. The computer was collected and the seal was still intact. We took it to Judge Sparks at the Kittitas County Courthouse. We were advised that all of the orders had been sent to Yakima County to be filed with the court clerk there. We were instructed to deposit the computer with the court clerk in Yakima County. Det. Janis and I returned to Yakima and deposited the computer with the court clerk at the Yakima County Courthouse. The computer was secured in her office.

On 3/29/11, I went to the Yakima Youth Soccer Offices at 313 S 11th Ave to inquire about the teams Dalan had coached. I met with office manager Sally Bredwell. I also spoke with YYSA vice-president Dan Gaulke via phone. I received the rosters of all of [REDACTED] teams that had been coached by Dalan. I also received rosters for the most recent teams she had played for after trying out and leaving Dalan's team. I learned that Dalan had coached recreational teams. [REDACTED] had gone to play for the Sun City Strikers after a try-out. The Strikers are a more elite and competitive program.

Bredwell located a tournament schedule for the District girls U-12 (under twelve) program. The schedule had a listing of times of games played and the names of the three coaches from YYSA that had teams playing in the tournament. This is believed to be the tournament that [REDACTED] describes in the Tri-Cities where one of the sexual encounters with Dalan is believed to have occurred. Bredwell also provided me with minutes from a YYSA Board of Directors meeting where Dalan resigned as the President of the YYSA. He had served as the president in 2007 and 2008.

Bredwell said that there had never been any complaints lodged against Dalan while he was a coach. He told me that all coaches undergo a background check prior to being allowed to coach. She told me that Dalan had an assistant coach named Kelly Sugden, who may have information about the team, including team schedules or dates of tournaments.

I contacted Kelly Sugden via telephone and identified myself as a detective. Sugden said that she had seen the reports about Dalan in the paper. She said that she was put in

contact with Dalan when she was asked to coach one of her daughters soccer teams. She had no coaching experience, so she assisted on Dalan's team as an assistant coach. Sugden said that Dalan also assisted with her team as her assistant coach. One of Sugden's daughters played on Dalan's team. She told me that since hearing the news reports, she kept wondering if there were signs or indicators that she had missed. Sugden said that she could not think of anything. She suggested that I contact Mike Shannon, who had also assisted on Dalan's team. She said that Shannon would likely have photos, soccer schedules and other information pertaining to the teams.

On 3/30/11 at approximately 1645 hours, I met with Mike Shannon and his daughter [REDACTED] at their residence at [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Both Mike and [REDACTED] had also seen the news reports regarding Dalan's arrest. They told me that they had been aware of some of the accusations prior to the arrest. [REDACTED] told me that at the beginning of March, she had encountered [REDACTED] at school. Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] attend Eisenhower High School, but [REDACTED] is a grade below.

[REDACTED] said that she had passed [REDACTED] and noticed that something was wrong. She said that [REDACTED] seemed stiff and was emotionally upset. [REDACTED] inquired what was the matter. [REDACTED] began crying. She asked [REDACTED] if she remembered "Aaron." [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that Aaron had molested her and she had just told a counselor. [REDACTED] asked if she had told her mother. [REDACTED] indicated that she had told her mother and her mother didn't do anything. [REDACTED] consoled [REDACTED] briefly and then parted.

[REDACTED] later told her mother and father, who no longer reside together. Her mother, who is a para-educator for the Yakima School District told [REDACTED] that she was going to have to report the disclosure as a mandated reporter. [REDACTED] asked her not to tell, because [REDACTED] had already discussed it with a counselor.

Mike Shannon said that it seemed out of character for Dalan, but he could not understand why [REDACTED] would make things up. He said that Dalan had a different personality, but usually seemed to interact well with the girls on his team. Shannon recalled one incident at a game, possibly in 2007, when Dalan became upset with one player on the team. Shannon said that Dalan became upset with Andrea, and was yelling at her on the sideline. He said that yelling became so intense that Andrea began crying. The referee had to come over and warn Dalan to discontinue or he would be removed from the field. Shannon said that Dalan's behavior during that game caught him off guard.

[REDACTED] said during the interview that Dalan was "weird." Mike Shannon stated that Dalan "Marched to the beat of his own drum" and that he was "different." Neither Mike nor [REDACTED] could remember any interactions or behaviors that they considered inappropriate. Mike said that he would attempt to look through old schedules, soccer documents, photos and videos to see if he could find dates of specific tournaments.

On 3/31/11, I met with Ryan Khallis one of [REDACTED] former soccer coaches. Khallis had coached [REDACTED] after she was selected through a try-out to play on the Sun City Striker's

team. Khallis coached [REDACTED] for two years after she left Dalan's recreational team. The interview was conducted at Khallis's place of employment in one of the offices.

Khallis told me that he coached [REDACTED] in 2009 and in 2010. He told me that [REDACTED] did not interact very much with other players. He said that there was always "drama" surrounding [REDACTED]. Khallis stated that he knew stuff was happening with her, due to the way she was acting. He said that she would pull herself away and always get down on herself when she didn't perform well.

Khallis told me that there was a mixture of different people in [REDACTED] life. He said that sometimes Artemio Rodriguez would pick [REDACTED] up from practice. Other times it would be Sonia, or [REDACTED] stepfather Pat True. Sometimes it would be a different family member or one of Sonia's legal assistant picking [REDACTED] up. Khallis did not recall ever seeing [REDACTED] picked up by Dalan. He told me that after [REDACTED] began playing soccer on his team Dalan "fizzled out" and ended his involvement with YYSAs.

Khallis told me that he always suspected something was wrong with [REDACTED]. He said that he asked her many times what was the matter. Khallis said that [REDACTED] always seemed like she wanted to talk about something. He said that she would stay after practice sometimes. [REDACTED] had discussed with Khallis all of the demands set by her mother and problems with her father. On one occasion, [REDACTED] told him about sexual abuse. He said that [REDACTED] did not name the person, but he believes that she indicated the abuser was not a family member. Khallis said that [REDACTED] did not give any details of the nature of the abuse.

Khallis said that he contacted Artemio Rodriguez and met him over lunch. He said that he informed Artemio about what [REDACTED] had disclosed. He did not notify anyone else of [REDACTED] disclosure.

Khallis made other observations. He said that on some days [REDACTED] would be very talkative. Other days she would be very quiet and reserved. He had observed cuts on her arms during practices. I asked Khallis when [REDACTED] cut her hair. He said that when she played on his team in 2009 her hair was long. Her hair was short when they played their 2010 season. At one point Khallis reports [REDACTED] having blue streaks in her hair. He also reports that [REDACTED] had a history of telling a wide variety of stories.

At the beginning of April 2011, Sonia Rodriguez contacted me regarding a book that [REDACTED] had in her room. She said that as she and [REDACTED] were cleaning the room, they came across the book. [REDACTED] told Sonia that Dalan had given it to her. The book titled "Reviving Ofelia" deals with problems faced by female adolescents. The book has highlighted sections and writing in the margins. Much of the subject matter deals with sex and sexual development.

Sonia brought the book to me and I collected it as evidence. Sonia told me that Evi Licona was present when Dalan had given it to her. After receiving the book, I made contact with [REDACTED]. She told me that Dalan had given her the book and that Licona was

there. [REDACTED] did not know why Dalan had given her the book and did not recall him saying anything upon presenting her with it.

[REDACTED] had told me that [REDACTED] may have told other friends at school about the abuse. She told me that [REDACTED] two closest friends at school were [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I went to Eisenhower High School on 4/5/11 to speak with the two girls. I met with them individually in the vice-principal's office. I met first with [REDACTED]. She told me that she first met [REDACTED] in the summer of 2010. [REDACTED] said that she played on the J.V. soccer team and [REDACTED] played Varsity.

[REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] had told her about the sexual abuse a few months prior to her disclosure to the counselor at the beginning of March. [REDACTED] said that she knew she was told about the abuse prior to Christmas. She told me that they were at her house when [REDACTED] told her about the abuse.

[REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] would frequently come to her house. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that she had been raped by her [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said that sometimes [REDACTED] would have "seizures" and begin talking about the abuse. Other times, [REDACTED] would talk openly with her about it. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] told her once that the rape occurred at "his" house. She reported that [REDACTED] had told her that her mother had dropped her off at the house.

I next spoke with [REDACTED]. She said that she met [REDACTED] through [REDACTED] after the fall sports ended. [REDACTED] said that she and [REDACTED] had been best friends and began hanging out with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said that she first became aware of the abuse while the girls were shopping at the Albertson's store near S 40th Ave and Tieton. She said that as they were going through the checkout [REDACTED] had one of her "seizures." [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] began to talk unconsciously or unknowingly about the rape. [REDACTED] also reports hearing of the abuse prior to Christmas, but after [REDACTED] had been hospitalized.

[REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] later told her and [REDACTED] about Aaron. [REDACTED] was told that Aaron had been the coach of [REDACTED] soccer team. [REDACTED] would talk about the abuse outside of the "seizures." [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] told her "he did it a lot." [REDACTED] told her she knew how many times she had been raped. [REDACTED] did not know how [REDACTED] knew this. She said that [REDACTED] always said that it was her fault. She told [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] "don't tell anyone." [REDACTED] also reports that [REDACTED] said "If it ever got out she would feel bad."

On 4/8/11, Artemio Rodriguez came to the Yakima Police Department for an interview. Artemio is [REDACTED] biological father. The interview was recorded using an audio recorder. Artemio described his relationship with Sonia and [REDACTED]. He described the living arrangements for [REDACTED] after he and Sonia divorced when [REDACTED] was about four years old. Artemio told me that after the divorce, he would get [REDACTED] on weekends.

Artemio described coaching or assisting in the coaching of [REDACTED] soccer teams. He said that his work schedule soon interfered with coaching and he had to stop. Artemio said that Dalan began coaching [REDACTED] team around 2005.

Artemio was aware of changes in [REDACTED] behavior. He said that he noticed the changes around the end of middle school and the beginning of high school. He said he observed [REDACTED] suffering panic attacks and having nightmares when she would stay at his residence. [REDACTED] developed sports induced asthma. Artemio also became aware of scratching and cutting. He told me that [REDACTED] had always been athletic, but her physical fitness seemed to have deteriorated.

Artemio described one instance where he contacted Dalan via text message. He told me that he was at one of [REDACTED] soccer tournaments. Artemio told me that he had seen Dalan at the tournament. He was not certain which tournament or when it was. Artemio believed it was the Midsummer Classic or the Yakattack Tournament. He said that [REDACTED] was uncomfortable with Dalan being there. Artemio said that he sent Dalan a text message asking Dalan to leave, which he did.

Artemio recalled having a conversation with [REDACTED] Striker coach Ryan Khallis. He said he met Khallis for lunch down at the K-Mart. Artemio said that he was aware of [REDACTED] having disclosed abuse by Daniel Nunez. He said that he and Khallis also talked about the position that [REDACTED] played on the team. He said that [REDACTED] was playing the sweeper and took it personally as a failure if the opposing team scored.

Artemio said that his wife had found a weekly planner from 2006. The planner was kept to document where [REDACTED] was staying each weekend due to some custody issues. Artemio allowed me to keep the planner in order to make copies. There were several entries showing when [REDACTED] stayed the weekend at Dalan's residence, or when he would drop off or pick up [REDACTED]. The planner was seized and collected as evidence.

On 4/12/11, I contacted Quinn Rosborough to schedule a second interview. Rosborough was extremely upset and emotional during the first interview conducted after learning of Dalan's arrest. I had also received information that Rosborough had been discussing the case at work with other employees. It had been reported at the County Prosecutor's Office that Rosborough had called [REDACTED] a "lying little bitch." Rosborough agreed to the second interview and set the time when she would be available the following day. On 4/13/11, I received a voice mail from local attorney Jim Davis who advised he was representing Rosborough.

I made phone contact with Davis at his request. He advised that Rosborough was willing to attend a second interview. He requested that Dalan's defense attorney David Allan sit in on the interview in Davis's stead. It was decided that it would be better for Davis to be present. Rosborough and Davis arrived at the Yakima Police Department for the interview at the time set by Rosborough.

The interview was recorded using an audio recorder. Rosborough told me that she had never met [REDACTED]. She had never spoken to her on the phone or communicated with her via text or email. Rosborough stated that Dalan had never really discussed [REDACTED] with her. She stated that Dalan never spoke badly about anyone and had never spoken ill of [REDACTED] in her presence.

Rosborough admitted to calling [REDACTED] a "lying little bitch" to a co-worker. When asked what the foundation for that statement was, Rosborough stated that it based on her knowledge of Dalan. She stated that the two had been together for approximately two years. Rosborough seemed to infer that because of her belief that Dalan could not commit the listed offense, [REDACTED] must be lying. Her belief was also based on her knowledge that [REDACTED] had previously reported sexual abuse and no charges were filed in that case. It should be noted that Rosborough claimed to have minimal knowledge of the details of the case involving Daniel Nunez.

Rosborough did not want to answer questions about her and Dalan's intimate relationship. She maintained that the two had not engaged in sexual intercourse. She had stated that the two had "made out" in the first interview. I began questioning to see if there were any other intimate activities that they may have been involved in. Davis interrupted and advised that they weren't going there.

Rosborough was very rigid during the interview. Her answers to questions were very short and concise. She seemed very defensive with a closed off posture. Rosborough admitted to discussing the case with family and some friends outside of Yakima. She refused to provide the names of the persons she discussed the matter with. A complete transcript of the interview with Rosborough will be attached to the report.

On 4/19/11, I received a notice that Lisa Kranz had come into the Yakima Police Department claiming to have information regarding this case. She left her phone number and I was able to make contact with her via telephone. Kranz told me that she had seen newspaper articles documenting Dalan's arrest. She told me that she had dated Dalan for a short time and that there were some coincidences that she felt might be helpful. I arranged to meet with Kranz later that afternoon.

I met with Kranz outside of her place of employment at G.E. Aviation on W Washington. Kranz told me that she had met Dalan through some friends when they would hang out at Bert's Pub. She said that she and Dalan and she began hanging out, primarily at his residence. She described his residence as a split level home, but did not know the address. Kranz indicated that the two dated casually for about two months April and May of 2010. She said that while they dated, they were not exclusive. She believes that they stopped dating in around the end of May or early June.

I asked Kranz about the coincidences she had discussed on the phone. She told me that she and Dalan were at his residence. She said that she began discussing financial problems that she had been having with her ex-husband and learned about earlier that day. Kranz reports that Dalan told her "Today must be the day to call your ex." He told

her that he had [REDACTED] previously and that [REDACTED] had also contacted him that day. Kranz said that Dalan went on to tell her that [REDACTED] had been on the city council. He told Kranz that she told him that his [REDACTED] had been sexually abused. Kranz did not know if Dalan had been called or if he met with [REDACTED]. She said that he seemed upset to learn about the reported abuse.

Kranz told me that she was involved in a sexual relationship with Dalan. She said that they had sex on one occasion at Dalan's residence. She stated that this occurred in Dalan's bed. Kranz could not recall any unusual behaviors or statements made during sex. She reported that Dalan had used a condom, and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was seen and treated at Seattle Children's Hospital in mid-October 2010. She was initially seen for chest pains. [REDACTED] was admitted for observation and soon released. [REDACTED] went back to Seattle Children's a few days later and was readmitted. She was diagnosed with Conflict Disorder and spent several days in the psychiatric unit at the hospital. The "dissociative episodes" described by Vaagen are believed to be part of the Conflict Disorder.

[REDACTED] was seen at the Generations OBGYN clinic on 4/23/11 after being referred by Yakima Pediatrics, her regular health care provider. [REDACTED] was seen as a precaution due to the alleged sexual contact with Dalan. [REDACTED] told the examiner that she had not had consensual intercourse with a partner. Records indicate that [REDACTED] hymen is not intact.

I have received medical records from Seattle Children's Hospital and from Generations OBGYN clinic. The records were received after obtaining medical release forms signed by [REDACTED]. Copies of the medical records are attached to this report.

I received records from Patricia Byers after obtaining a signed release from [REDACTED] Byers at one time a therapist working with Reina. [REDACTED] had named Dalan in one of the counseling sessions with Byers. I was provided with copies of the sessions in which Dalan was discussed. The therapy notes state that [REDACTED] felt confused due to inappropriate touching. These records are attached to the report.

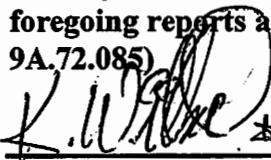

George labeled the mattress for identification. Grant and I removed the mattress and later carried it into the property room at the Yakima Police Department. Sgt. George was present when we left the mattress.

That concluded our participation with the warrant service.

On the 06/08/2010 I was assigned to conduct follow up interviews for a case that Detective Oja was working. I was directed to interview Sonia Rodriguez and her daughter [REDACTED], regarding a subsequent allegation involving Aaron Dalan. Dalan was [REDACTED] to Sonia and had close involvement in [REDACTED] life during that time period. Detective Oja received information during his interview with the primary suspect Daniel Nunez that included Dalan in the suspect pool. Nunez stated that [REDACTED] texted a message to a relative of her's on the Westside that Dalan was abusing her. It was determined that follow up interviews were necessary, at which point they were arranged for this date.

At 1530hrs I met with Sonia and [REDACTED] I interviewed [REDACTED] first. We spoke in the Yakima Police Department Special Assault Unit's child interview room. The interview as recorded onto a DVD.

As a result of the interview with [REDACTED] I was told the following. Dalan was [REDACTED] for a few years. During that time Dalan acted as a father figure to [REDACTED]. He coached her soccer during the time that he was [REDACTED] Sonia and continued coaching for a while after [REDACTED]. When I asked [REDACTED] about why she was asked to come to the office on this date, she responded by telling me, because of what happened with Aaron Dalan. I asked her what happened. She stated that in 2006 she was in the 6th grade. [REDACTED] stated she was spending the weekend with Dalan, this particular weekend. She recalled Dalan calling her into his bedroom, at which point she noticed that he only had a pair of boxer shorts on. Dalan told [REDACTED] to come into bed with him. Once in bed Dalan wrapped himself around [REDACTED] and held onto her. [REDACTED] stated nothing more occurred and she felt the behavior was inappropriate. I asked [REDACTED] if she remembered where Dalan lived back then. She stated that he lived near the Albertson's on 40th Ave back then. [REDACTED] stated she told her mother after it happened. [REDACTED] also stated that she continued to go over to Dalan's house after the incident, stating nothing more ever occurred. After receiving the information from [REDACTED] regarding this incident, there appeared to be a point where [REDACTED] just shut down and would not speak further about Aaron. There was a definite change in demeanor, which I picked up on while

interviewing her. [REDACTED] became closed off and withdrawn from her original demeanor. Based on my training and experience, I recognized this to likely mean she was not comfortable or at a point where she felt it was ok for her to speak further about Aaron's conduct. Based on my training and experience, I felt it best not to engage in leading and or directive questioning at this point. I reassured her that it's not uncommon for children to only talk about what their comfortable talking about. I concluded the interview at that time and later advised Detective Oja of my observations.

After talking to [REDACTED] I then interviewed Sonia. Sonia agreed to audio recorded interview. I asked her about the allegations regarding Dalan. She stated that [REDACTED] had told her about them after it occurred. At which time she brought it up to Dalan. Dalan didn't seem to think much of the incident. Sonia stated that she brought up the incident about a month ago during May 2010 to Dalan. Again Dalan didn't seem to be bothered by the incident, stating that he would talk to [REDACTED] if Sonia felt it necessary. After the May conversation nothing further was mentioned about the incident.

After the conclusion of the two interviews, I forwarded the information to Detective Oja. Detective Oja forwarded the information provided in these two statements along with the Nunez information to the Prosecuting Attorney's Office. No charges were filed on either case because of lack of supporting evidence, believing the burden of proof would be difficult to prove at this point. This case went cold at this point.

No further contact with [REDACTED] was initiated until Detective Sigler investigated a report of possible child abuse in November of 2010. See attached case 10-17942. Said report indicated that [REDACTED] reported being assaulted by her [REDACTED] Artemio Rodriguez. Detective Sigler cleared the case Exceptionally.

The next time investigators would have contact with [REDACTED] would be for this most current investigation.

On 03/09/2011 Detective Oja received a report of sexual abuse, where [REDACTED] further acknowledges in a therapy session with Lindsey Vaagan LICSW that Aaron Dalan "raped" her. Ms Vaagan being a mandatory reported completed a telephone report to Child Protective Service (CPS).

Detective Oja later arranged for Kittitas County Child Interview Specialist Lisa Larabie conduct the interview with [REDACTED]

03/15/2011 Ms. Larabie conducted a nearly 3 hour interview with [REDACTED] at the Yakima Police Department Child Interview Room, located with in the Special Assault Unit. As result of the interview Detective Oja developed probable cause to support the investigation of Aaron F. Dalan for multiple counts of sexual assault.

On 03/18/2011 I rejoined the investigative efforts. I assisted Detective Oja in preparing a One Party Consent Application and Order. I also assisted him in preparing search warrants. I collected the legal description of Aaron Dalan's residence at 209 S.

39th Ave. I also made contact with Marilyn Brenneman formally of King Co. Prosecuting Attorney's Office (Retired). I asked her for advice on this case, due to Aaron's employment as an attorney. Ms. Brenneman stated that Special Master Appointment would be required since he was an attorney and some of the items or information being sought in a search warrant may obtain privileged information. She advised of the steps to do so. Detective Oja prepared the appropriate orders with the Special Master considerations.

After preparing all the orders, Lt. Mike Merryman signed and approved the use of the One Party Consent. Yakima City Prosecutor Bronson Faul read and made approval for probable cause purposes of the all the orders. [REDACTED] and her mother signed the Consent to conduct recorded calls.

Due to likely conflicts on interests in the Yakima County Courts, we staffed the case with Prosecutor James Hagarty. He stated that using Kittitas County Superior Court Judge Sparks to sign the orders would be appropriate, however he asked us to confirm with Yakima County Superior Court Criminal Presiding Judge Reukauf first. Detective Oja, Deputy Prosecutor Therese Murphy and I presented in Judge Reukauf's Chambers. We advised that there was a case we were working on and it was highly likely that all the Yakima County Judges would recuse themselves if they were made aware of who was involved. No information was provided on the subject of this investigation to Ms. Murphy or Judge Reukauf. Judge Reukauf stated that using Judge Sparks would be ok since there was a likelihood of conflicts and that was a Superior Court Judge who could sign an order for any County in the State.

03/18/2011 at approximately 1600hrs Detective Oja and I, along with Mr. Faul presented in Kittitas County Judge Sparks' Chambers. We presented him the One Party Consent Application and Order, the search warrant affidavit and order, and the Special Master Order. Judge Sparks read all the applications, affidavits and orders. He placed Detective Oja under oath and granted judicial approval for all orders. Mr. Faul prepared a court order sealing the information, which was granted by Judge Sparks.

1628hrs the orders were filed with the Kittitas County Court Clerks Office. After having the orders signed and approved, we concluded our efforts for this day.

03/19/2011 at approximately 1745hrs Detective Oja and met with [REDACTED] at her residence ([REDACTED]). There we met with [REDACTED] her mother Sonia Rodriguez and Step-Father Patrick True. We advised what the process would be for making the recorded calls. After the explanation, Sonia and Patrick left the residence, so we could attempt the process.

First we prepared [REDACTED] for the calls, showing her how to use the equipment. She used the Olympus TP7 ear piece recorder connected to an Olympus Digital Recorder. After it was obvious that she was comfortable with the equipment, we decided to make the first call.

1807hrs [REDACTED] dialed Aaron's cell phone number. There was no answer. After several minutes with no return call from Aaron, two text messages were sent to Pam Dalan, Aaron's mother. Pam was asked to relay a message to Aaron that [REDACTED] was attempting to get a hold of him. Several minutes later Aaron called [REDACTED] cell phone and left a message to call him back.

[REDACTED] called Aaron back, at which time he answered. Their conversation was several minutes long. During this call, [REDACTED] establishes a dialogue with Aaron about soccer and other common interests. She then goes into the disclosure of sexual abuse. Aaron never at any point denies the abuse, however he indicates confusion on what she's talking about. Aaron appeared to be trying to get more information from her. After several minutes going by, [REDACTED] ended the call. (See transcript)

On 03/21/2011 during the evening Detective Oja and I met with [REDACTED] at her residence once again. We attempted two more calls which went un-answered.

03/22/2011 Detective Oja prepared an SIR for Aaron Dalan, requesting multiple charges of child sexual assault.

1530hrs Detective Oja and took Aaron into custody outside of the Yakima County Jail, as he was leaving a court appearance. As we met with him in the parking lot, we maintained a discreet approach with Dalan, understanding his position in the community. We asked him to speak with us, at which point he appeared confused. We advised him there was probable cause for his arrest. At this point he shrugged his shoulders and let out a sigh. He began to make a statement, but quickly stopped himself. Aaron never knew what the charges were or had any questions about the investigation. He was secured in the front seat of Detective Oja's assigned car. A quick check for weapons was completed of his person and brief case. Afterward his brief case was given back to him, since it likely contained privileged material. Detective Oja read Aaron his Rights from his Department Issued Card. Aaron stated he understood and invoked his Right to Counsel.

Aaron was transported to the Yakima Police Department. In transit no questions were asked to Aaron regarding this case. Once we arrived at YPD we secured Aaron in an interview room, with his briefcase. We secured his two cell phones outside of the room, powered off.

I called Prosecutor Hagarty and advised him we had Aaron in custody. I asked Mr. Hagarty to make arrangements with the Department of Assigned Counsel (DAC) to have someone come and pick up Aaron's work material.

A short time later DAC Attorney Paul Kelley arrived at the police department. Mr. Kelley was provided an opportunity to meet with Aaron in private. After the two of them met, I turned over all of Aaron's work material.

We maintained his personal cell phone as evidence in this case, awaiting a Special Master Appointment to review the content.

Shortly after the arrest of Aaron, investigators interviewed his girlfriend Quinn Rosborough, who at the time was employed by the Yakima County Prosecuting Attorney's Office as a Deputy Prosecutor assigned to the Special Assault Unit.

After Investigators interviewed Quinn, we then prepared to conduct the search warrant on Aaron's residence. Aaron was transported to the residence to advise investigators of what material may be privileged.

During the search warrant several items of evidence were collected. My initial task was to video the search warrant. I video taped most of the search until the camera battery died. After videoing the warrant, I helped tag and mark items of evidence.

During the conclusion of the search warrant, Aaron's neighbor, local defense attorney Greg Scott approached investigators. I made contact with Mr. Scott and advised him he could approach Aaron if he wished. Mr. Scott declined. Arrangements were made between Mr. Scott and Aaron to pick up Aaron's car at the county building.

At the conclusion of the search warrant Detective Oja and I decided to maintain the evidence at a third party police department since the courts in Kittitas County were then closed. We decided to transport Aaron and the property seized to Kittitas County Sheriff's Office and maintain it there until we could turn it over to the Court for Special Master review. After securing the evidence at Kittitas County Sheriff's Office with the assistance of KCSO Detective Darren Higashiyama we then headed back to Yakima. We stopped briefly at the Subway in Ellensburg where we ate dinner and purchased Aaron a meal as well. We then went to the Yakima County Jail. Upon arrival I spoke to Booking Sergeant Burwell, advising him of the person we had in custody and requested to keep him separated from general population. Aaron was then turned over to the Yakima County Jail and booked on the SIR.

03/23/2011 Detective Oja and I went back to Kittitas County Sheriff's Office. We collected the evidence and took it to Judge Sparks. When we arrived at Judge Sparks' chambers he advised that Yakima County Clerk Kim Eaton requested that the orders and evidence be filed and maintained in Yakima. We took the evidence to Kim Eaton's Office and turned it over to her.

Detective conducted further follow up interviews with witnesses beyond this date.

I was assigned to interview Therese Murphy, who was Quinn Rosborough's supervisor during the Nunez investigation, where Aaron's name first presented.

04/14/2011 at 0730hrs I met with Therese Murphy. I asked her about her knowledge of the case. She stated she had a very limited knowledge. I asked her about what she knew about the Nunez case, and the allegations regarding Aaron during that case. She stated she was aware of that case. I asked her if she discussed that case with Ms. Rosborough. She stated no she did not. I asked her if she had a position on the

current case. She stated it would not be appropriate for her to make opinion regarding the case. Ms. Murphy indicated that she was close friends with Ms. Rosborough and regularly socializes with her. (See attached transcript)

06/24/2011 I was assigned to interview Eve Licona and Ryan Khalis.

1200hrs I met with Eve Licona at her Law Practice. I took a recorded statement regarding follow up questions that we had. I talked to Ms. Licona for several minutes about her previous relationship with Aaron. She stated that the two had dated a few years back and were engaged to get married. The two broke up, due to Aaron's infidelities and other secretive activity that Ms. Licona stated she started to become aware of. I asked Ms. Licona about the investigation. I asked her if she spoke to anyone about the case. She stated she spoke to Det. Oja during the first interview. I asked her if she spoke to Aaron about the case. She stated no. I asked her if she spoke to [REDACTED] about the case. She stated that on 3/19/2011 [REDACTED] contacted Ms. Licona and asked her if she was mad at her. Ms. Licona told [REDACTED] she was not mad at her. The two made arrangements to go to the park. Ms. Licona said she confirmed with Sonia that is was ok. Ms. Licona picked [REDACTED] up at their house and the two went to Eschbach Park. During this contact, [REDACTED] asked Ms. Licona if she believed her. Ms. Licona indicates that she does not know what is being alleged and doesn't know what to believe. Ms. Licona said that [REDACTED] very much wanted to know if she believed her. It was the first statement she made that day. Ms. Licona described [REDACTED] demeanor at the time to be sullen and she also appeared to be burdened. Ms. Licona reassured [REDACTED] as best she could with out getting into the topic of the case. She said that she told [REDACTED] that's its more important for [REDACTED] to believe that was she is saying is right, because it affects a lot of people. I asked Ms. Licona if [REDACTED] talked about the investigative techniques used in this case. She stated [REDACTED] told her that the police were going to record a call between her and Aaron. She really did not know what that technique is called and that wasn't something she was willing to talk to [REDACTED] about. I asked her if she told Aaron about that. She stated no. I asked if she knew if Greg Scott mentioned anything about this case to Aaron prior to his arrest. She said she wouldn't have an answer to that. She also indicated that any conversations she had with Mr. Scott, would be protected by attorney client privilege. (See transcript)

After interviewing Ms. Licona I made contact with Ryan Khalis. I made an appointment to meet with him later that same afternoon.

At 1430hrs I met with Mr. Khalis at his place of employment, Mobile Fleet Services (2003 E. Viola Ave, Yakima WA). At 1436 I started the interview with him. We spoke about his knowledge of Aaron Dalan and [REDACTED]. He stated that he knew both of them from youth soccer. Aaron was a coach for a rival Yakima Team several years back. [REDACTED] was on that team. Aaron had previously offended Mr. Khalis when he tried to recruit kids from his team behind his back. Short of that, he did not have much contact with him. When [REDACTED] became older, she later played on Mr. Khalis' team. [REDACTED] was a good soccer player, which he ranked as average on his team. His team was made up of select quality soccer athletes, and described [REDACTED] as not the best, but not the worst on the team. On several occasions it was difficult for him to coach [REDACTED] because her

moods and temperaments changed to frequently. Some days she was outgoing and positive. However a lot of the time she standoffish from the rest of the team. She commonly kept to herself and didn't participate fully. Mr. Khalis said he noticed that she was cutting herself. He addressed this issue with her and her father Artemio. Mr. Khalis concluded with provided me some copies of team rosters.

After we completed these interviews, I prepared copies to be sent to the Prosecutor's Office.

On 07/05/2011 Detective Oja and I attempted to identify the location of Aaron's family's cabin in the Cle Elum Washington area. We located the address of 681 Thornton Creek Lane, Cle Elum WA. This address showed that Pam Dalan was the owner. Records checks indicated that Pam was Aaron's mother. Detective Oja and I drove to this location for photographs and follow up.

At approximately 1430hrs we arrived in the area. This cabin sits several miles south of I-90 in the Elk Heights area. When we arrived in the area, we snapped photographs from roadway leading up to the cabin, from several hundred yards away. Upon arrival to the cabin property, we could see a white female outside doing yard work. We exited our car and made contact with the female. We advised her who we were and the agency we represented. We let her know that we were conducting follow up on the Dalan investigation. We confirmed her identity as Pam Dalan, Aaron's mother. When we asked her if we could take some photographs of the outside of the property, she denied us permission without a search warrant. She told us we could contact her attorney David Allan if we needed further. Pam then told us "all these false allegations were really starting to get to us". We thanked her for talking to us and left the property.

In further staffing of this case with Deputy Prosecutor Patti Powers, Detective Oja and I decided to attempt to make personal contact with Sophia and Emiliana Morales in Bellingham WA.

07/08/2011 at 1040hrs Detective Oja and I interviewed Sophia at a Starbucks Coffee Shop in Bellingham WA. We spoke for several minutes regarding her relationship to this case. She talked about the times when [REDACTED] lived with her and times when [REDACTED] would visit. She also spoke about times that she had contact with Aaron. She stated that seen him a few months back in Western WA. After speaking with Sophia we asked her if she we could interview her daughter [REDACTED]. She stated that would be fine, at which time she had her husband bring [REDACTED] to the location we were at. Another person that Sophia felt we should talk to was a person who Sonia kind of dated in and between her relationships with Aaron and Patrick. The person who she only knew as Clark, and that he was a therapist of some sort, that used to work with kids and the courts in Yakima. Sonia said that Clark would text [REDACTED] about how beautiful she was and also gifted her on several occasions. Sonia just felt that some of the contact they had was rather odd or suspicious. (See transcript)

1230hrs we spoke to [REDACTED] She told us about the time that she received call from [REDACTED] who told her that Aaron did the same thing as Nunez did to her. [REDACTED] stated that she told her mother about this. [REDACTED] also talked about her relationship with Aaron. (See transcript)

After talking to both Sophia and [REDACTED] we then left Bellingham and went to Seattle Childrens Hospital.

1440hrs There we made contact with Medical Records Health Information Officer Rob Dorgan. He allowed us to view [REDACTED] entire and complete medical record. We found several documents that were not present in the digital record they sent us. We made copies of all the records that would fit in a copy machine and requested copies of everything else to be mailed to us.

1530hrs we met with Ann Moore RN MS of the Seattle Childrens Hospital Psychiatric Unit. We talked to her about locating the officials who conducted some of [REDACTED] treatment during her stay at the Psychiatric Unit. Ms. Moore indicated that the only person still in the Unit would be Dr. Dan Crawford. Ms. Moore advised that Childrens in a teaching hospital and the rest of the staff who saw [REDACTED] would be on other rotations somewhere else. She advised that the University of WA may have way of contacting them.

After conducting the above follow up we forwarded the information to the Prosecutors Office.

07/14/2011 I made contact with [REDACTED] regarding her knowledge of [REDACTED] and Aaron Dalan.

1400hrs she came to the police department where I interviewed her. She talked about the fact that she played on Aaron and [REDACTED] soccer team several years back. She thought Aaron was a nice guy, however he knew very little about soccer. She stated that one time when she was younger he yelled at her at a game. She stated crying because she had never been yelled at before by a coach. She said that she did something wrong on the field and he got after her about it. He later apologized. [REDACTED] also spoke about times that Aaron would give her rides to soccer tournaments out of town. She stated that if it was an overnight tournament, Aaron would always stay in a different room. She did not ever notice anything strange with Aaron, other than kids and coaches from other teams thought he was strange. She maybe thought it was because he did not know anything about soccer. (See transcript)

After completing this interview, this information was forwarded to the prosecutor's office.

07/14/2011 at approximately 1400hrs Detective Oja and YPD Evidence Technician Amber Ross started to process some of the evidence under an alternative light source (BLUEMAXX forensic light by SERCHIE tm.)

At the conclusion of this follow up we turned over our reports to the prosecutors office.
